Alien Registration: This copy of the Notice to Appear served upon you is evidence of your alien registration while you are in removal proceedings. You are required to carry it with you at all times.

Representation: If you so choose, you may be represented in this proceeding, at no expense to the Government, by an attorney or other individual authorized and qualified to represent persons before the Executive Office for Immigration Review, pursuant to 8 CFR 1003.16. Unless you so request, no hearing will be scheduled earlier than ten days from the date of this notice, to allow you sufficient time to secure counsel. A list of qualified attorneys and organizations who may be available to represent you at no cost will be provided with this notice.

Conduct of the hearing: At the time of your hearing, you should bring with you any affidavits or other documents that you desire to have considered in connection with your case. If you wish to have the testimony of any witnesses considered, you should arrange to have such witnesses present at the hearing. At your hearing you will be given the opportunity to admit or deny any or all of the allegations in the Notice to Appear, including that you are inadmissible or removable. You will have an opportunity to present evidence on your own behalf, to examine any evidence presented by the Government, to object, on proper legal grounds, to the receipt of evidence and to cross examine any witnesses presented by the Government. At the conclusion of your hearing, you have a right to appeal an adverse decision by the immigration judge. You will be advised by the immigration judge before whom you appear of any relief from removal for which you may appear eligible including the privilege of voluntary departure. You will be given a reasonable opportunity to make any such application to the immigration judge.

One-Year Asylum Application Deadline: If you believe you may be eligible for asylum, you must file a Form 1-589, Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal. The Form 1-589, Instructions, and information on where to file the Form can be found at www.uscis.gov/1-589. Failure to file the Form 1-589 within one year of arrival may bar you from eligibility to apply for asylum pursuant to section 208(a)(2)(B) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

Failure to appear: You are required to provide the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), in writing, with your full mailing address and telephone number. You must notify the Immigration Court and the DHS immediately by using Form EOIR-33 whenever you change your address or telephone number during the course of this proceeding. You will be provided with a copy of this form. Notices of hearing will be mailed to this address. If you do not submit Form EOIR-33 and do not otherwise provide an address at which you may be reached during proceedings, then the Government shall not be required to provide you with written notice of your hearing. If you fail to attend the hearing at the time and place designated on this notice, or any date and time later directed by the Immigration Court, a removal order may be made by the immigration judge in your absence, and you may be arrested and detained by the DHS.

Mandatory Duty to Surrender for Removal: If you become subject to a final order of removal, you must surrender for removal to your local DHS office, listed on the internet at <http://www.ice.gov/contact/ero>, as directed by the DHS and required by statute and regulation. Immigration regulations at 8 CFR 1241.1 define when the removal order becomes administratively final. If you are granted voluntary departure and fail to depart the United States as required, fail to post a bond in connection with voluntary departure, or fail to comply with any other condition or term in connection with voluntary departure, you must surrender for removal on the next business day thereafter. If you do not surrender for removal as required, you will be ineligible for all forms of discretionary relief for as long as you remain in the United States and for ten years after your departure or removal. This means you will be ineligible for asylum, cancellation of removal, voluntary departure, adjustment of status, change of nonimmigrant status, registry, and related waivers for this period. If you do not surrender for removal as required, you may also be criminally prosecuted under section 243 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

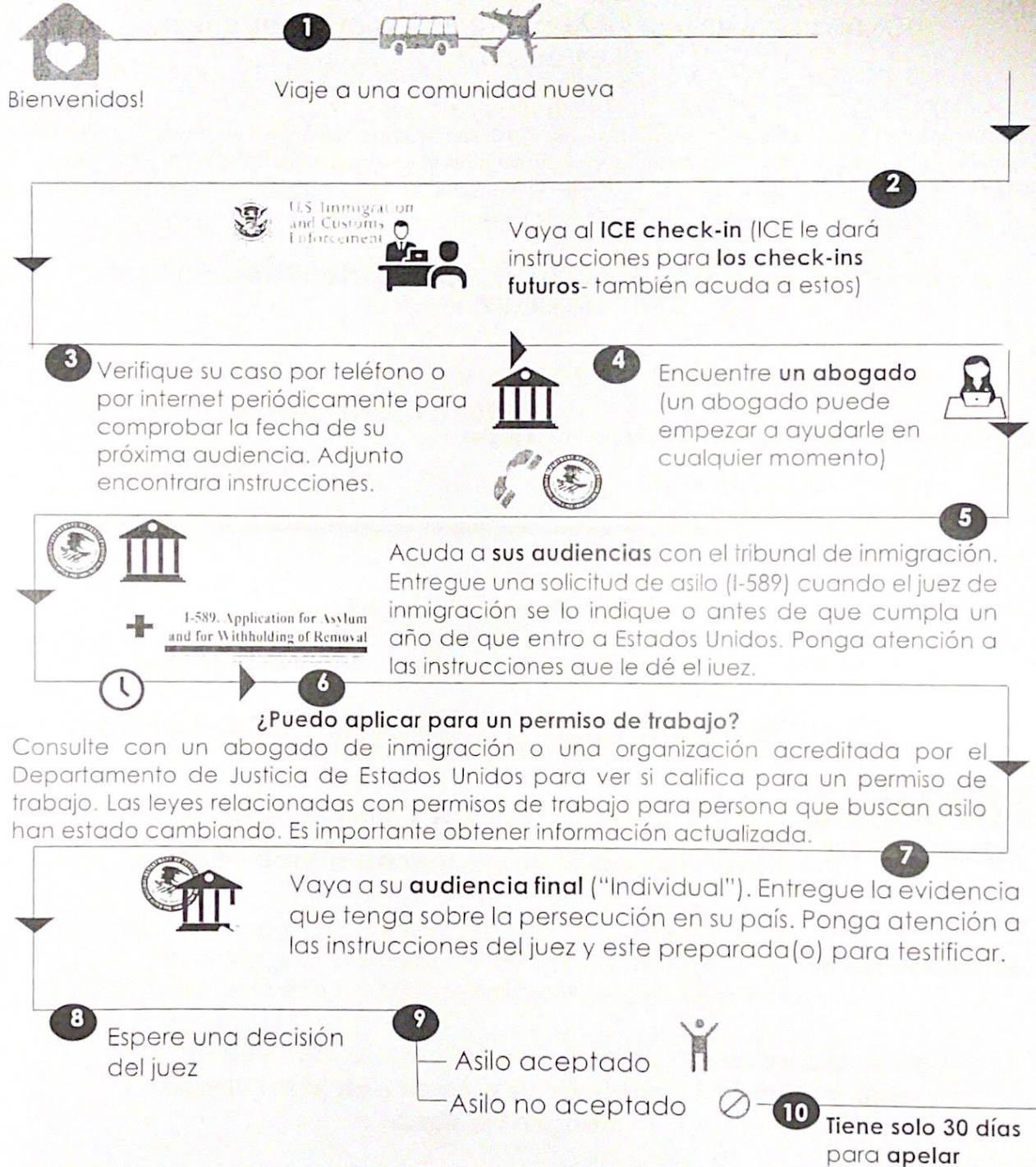

Una persona liberada en la frontera que quiere solicitar asilo tomará muchos pasos antes de que el gobierno de Estados Unidos tome una decisión. Cada caso es único, pero aquí presentamos una ruta típica:



¿Quiere Solicitar Asilo?

¿Qué puedo hacer si tengo miedo de regresar a mi país de origen?

Asilo es un tipo de protección que permite a una persona quedarse en los Estados Unidos en lugar de ser enviado de vuelta a un país donde tiene miedo de regresar a **causa de la persecución**.

El asilo **no** es una garantía. Las personas que esperan obtener asilo necesitan solicitarlo, y mostrarle al gobierno que califican para ello.

Para solicitar asilo, hay que completar y entregar **una solicitud de asilo. (Form I-589):**

Los Próximos Pasos

Las personas puestas en libertad en la frontera generalmente no tienen derecho automático para vivir en los EEUU. Aún hay más que hacer, que puede incluir:

- Acudir a todas las **citas y audiencias en los tribunales**.

Si no se presenta a todas sus audiencias con el tribunal de inmigración, su ausencia podría resultar en una orden de deportación del juez de inmigración.

Posteriormente, en este documento, le informaremos cómo localizar las fechas de sus citas y audiencias en los tribunales de inmigración.

- Informarle al gobierno sobre cualquier **cambio de domicilio**.

Si no le informa a inmigración y al tribunal de inmigración (dos agencias separadas) sobre una nueva dirección, podría no recibir documentos importantes sobre su próximas citas o actualizaciones de su caso. El no recibir esta información podría resultar en una orden de deportación del juez o complicaciones en su caso de inmigración.

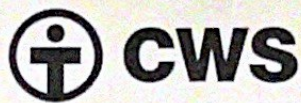
- Inscribir a los niños en **la escuela**

- Obedecer todas **las leyes de Estados Unidos**

No es fácil establecerse en un nuevo país. Pero, las personas puestas en libertad en la frontera pueden tomar algunos pasos en pro de la seguridad propia y de sus familias. Estos incluyen:

- Tratar de encontrar **un abogado** (encontrará enlaces a páginas de internet en este paquete)
- Encontrar **fuentes de información sobre** asistencia médica, legal, y de vivienda, entre otras.

Estos recursos pueden ser encontrados en centros de asistencia telefónica, sitios web, por medio de maestros, u organizaciones confiables. A continuación encontrará algunas fuentes de asistencia confiables.
