1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON AVAILABILITY OF FEDERAL
2	FUNDS FOR CERTAIN ANIMAL RESEARCH.
3	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
4	sion of law, no Federal funds may be made available to
5	conduct, support, or fund (directly or indirectly) any cov-
6	ered research on a qualified animal.
7	(b) Definitions.—In this section:
8	(1) COVERED RESEARCH.—The term "covered
9	research" means any research to study the effects of
10	drugs, hormones, surgery, or other interventions to
11	alter the body of a qualified animal to no longer cor-
12	respond to the biological sex of such animal, includ-
13	ing by—
14	(A) disrupting the development of an ani-
15	mal's body;
16	(B) inhibiting the natural functions of the
17	animal's body; or
18	(C) modifying the physical appearance of
19	an animal.
20	(2) Excepted animal.—The term "excepted
21	animal" means any non-human vertebrate that—
22	(A) changes sex during its lifetime; or
23	(B) naturally possesses both male and fe-
24	male reproductive organs.
25	(3) QUALIFIED ANIMAL.—The term "qualified
26	animal" means any non-human vertebrate species

- 2 mammals, birds, fish, reptiles, and amphibians.
